### Chair's Report (Councillor Maria Gatland)

Over the years we have always been very appreciative and grateful for the support of the members of the Friends. You have been extremely generous in your donations to support the work we have done in maintaining the character of the Hurst for the benefit of the community. This report outlines the more recent projects that we have been or are working on.

### No Cycling Signage

The most complaints we have received relate to cycling in the Hurst and some time ago we started on a project to replace the signs with more up to date versions. Whilst it has taken rather longer than we anticipated the majority of the new No Cycling signs have been installed. These signs have been funded entirely by the Friends from donations made by our members



### Holly Clearance

Holly has its place in woodland and provides food for birds but unchecked growth has a major impact on the woodland floor, wild flowers and trees have been losing out. We have carried out a controlled removal of holly and gentle opening of the canopy. As a result wood anemones have started to appear again on the Upper Selsdon Road side of the Hurst.

### Maintenance of the Views from the Top of the Hurst

The southern panorama from the top of the Hurst has always been an attraction for the visitors to the site and extends as far as the North Downs. There are two main viewing areas and we have carried out a program of careful maintenance to ensure that visitors can continue to enjoy the spectacular views.

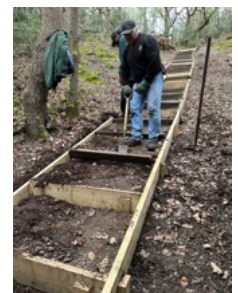


### Pudding Stone (Conglomerate)

The hill is formed of Thanet Sand topped with a pebble bed and resting on a surface of chalk, however the hill has suffered from erosion. A natural iron oxide based cement binding the Blackheath Pebble Beds into conglomerate or 'pudding stone' has slowed down the erosion process. The pudding stone is visible on the top of the Hurst. Recently some visitors have set up camp and imported materials to the site and left behind a large amount of rubbish that needed to be taken away. We have arranged for the site to be cleared back to its original state and we are hoping that visitors will respect the history and enable people to enjoy the site as it was.

### Steps

Over time the steps that climb from near the meadow to the top of the main clearing have deteriorated. The Friends have funded a program of work to replace and refurbish them. This work is being undertaken by the Downlands Partnership and should be completed by the end of May. Anyone who has climbed to the top will appreciate this essential maintenance!!!
